

List of specimens of the tribe Cossyphini (Coleoptera: Tenebrionidae) kept in the National Museum, Praha

Abstract. Beetles of the tribe Cossyphini (family Tenebrionidae), deposited in the National Museum, Praha (Czech Republic) are identified and listed. The following new records are published: *Cossyphus (Cossyphus) dejeani* Brême, 1846 (Italy: Sardinia); *C. (C.) hoffmannseggi* Herbst, 1797 (France: Corsica; Italy: Sicily, Sardinia), and *C. (C.) tauricus* Steven, 1829 (Azerbaijan, Georgia).

Introduction

The tribe Cossyphini (Coleoptera: Tenebrionidae) contains only two genera and was recently revised by SCUPOLA (2000, 2006). The genus *Cossyphus* Olivier, 1791, currently contains 33 species and subspecies occurring in the Palaearctic, Oriental and Afrotropical regions; the genus *Endustomus* Brême, 1842, includes 34 species and subspecies distributed in the Afrotropical region. Data on 14 species (altogether 295 specimens) deposited in the National Museum, Praha, are presented here.

Material and methods

Species are arranged alphabetically, the nomenclature and zoogeography follow SCUPOLA (2000, 2006). All specimens were revised or identified by the author.

Locality labels are cited in their original version. Remarks of the author are found in square brackets. Separate labels are indicated by double slash (/).
